Warming Center: under certain conditions open 6 pm to 8 am. Hot food and drinks, and a safe place to be, offering sofas, loveseats, and recliners. Volunteers welcome. Food, drinks and other supplies are donated by the community People's Place: eleven-bedroom boarding-style residence that is a low rent (\$450). All utilities and laundry included. Difficult placements accepted.
